### **CLOTHING CENTER VOLUNTEERS URGENTLY NEEDED!!!**

The MPC Clothing Center has been operating out of our church basement for 41 years and is a vibrant mission of our church. One hundred percent of the proceeds are distributed to both local and global non-profit agencies and organizations by our Outreach Committee. But it is a mission which requires the time and dedication of volunteers to run smoothly. Though the Clothing Center is currently only open on Thursday, from 10:00 a.m.–2:00 p.m., the prep work and set-up is done on Wednesday afternoon from noon–2:30 p.m. We need help as currently we only have four regular volunteers and three intermittent volunteers who may only work 1 day/wk or 2 days/month. We need strong backs, for there is a lot of lifting, and more helping hands during the following:

- Wednesdays: noon–2:30 p.m. to price incoming clothing and merchandise, change merchandise seasonally, straighten the racks/shelves and set-up for Thursday
- Thursdays: 9:30 a.m.–2:15 p.m.
  - 9:30 a.m.–10:00 a.m. to complete set-up & displays
  - 10:00 a.m.–2:00 p.m. to assist shoppers, check-out customers, accept and price donations, and straighten racks/shelves
  - 1:45 p.m.–2:15 p.m. to put everything away. This is the day where we really need volunteers – to operate efficiently we need 4 volunteers. We have made it work with 3, but it can get busy and we have to put away all the merchandise at the end of the day. Right now, there are days when we only have 2 volunteers, and that just doesn't work well at all.
- Biannual Open House: Open Houses are held on a Saturday in early December and Spring from 9:00 a.m.–noon. On those occasions, we need support in set-up, assisting shoppers and cleaning up afterwards.

Please consider helping out, and fitting us into your schedule, even if it is only one day a week or month or be “on-call” when needed. That would give our regular volunteers a much-needed break or a backup when other commitments create a conflict, thus insuring that the Clothing Center remains open to our community. I have been at Doylestown since September 2023, and enjoyed every minute as the congregation moves forward writing a new chapter. They are ready to call a new senior pastor, thus I am open for another position. As my wife says, "Tom, you don't know how to retire!" Truth is, I love ministry and am grateful to share with others what I have learned over the years of ministry and what I learn from them. I hope this gives you a glimpse into my journey of faith, life, joys, and laughs.*

We look forward to welcoming Tom to MPC on November 18 as he helps guide us through this time of transition.
